UP: It's been a year since Haiti was hit by a massive earthquake which killed 220,000, injured thousands more and left 1.5 million homeless. Fortunately, Mission Possible, a nonprofit Christian agency based in Findlay, is continuing to help those in need. Volunteers recently set up medical clinics at each of Mission Possible's schools in the country, which serve approximately 3,500 students. The medical clinics served 649 patients in four days. The group educated about 1,000 people on cholera and teeth brushing and passed out 1,000 adult and children health kits that included soap, shampoo, a toothbrush, toothpaste, floss -- items which had been donated by Findlay residents. Bravo!
